Please be aware that the Judges will not have time to watch you perform your experiment. The Judges will be interested in your notes and descriptions of the experiment but, more importantly, want to listen to you present your hypothesis, results, and conclusions in a clear and concise manner.

Listed below are just a few ideas for things to replace items that we cannot allow in the Fair. All projects will be carefully checked and all unsafe materials will be removed, even if they are not on this list. If you have any questions, ask us during check-in or email lsears@petrelrob.com before the fair.

Note 1: If your project used animals or human subjects, you must file an Ethics and Due Care Form prior to starting work on your experiment.

Note 2: You may not enter a project that used human tissues, fluids, teeth, hair, etc. unless you are in Grades 10-12 AND you have special permission from CYSFS.
